Recycling With A Greater Purpose

The Medical Connection

In early 2010, Cornerstone acquired a medical procurement program from Sharing Resources Worldwide, in Madison, Wisconsin. Re-engineered into MedCAN, this program receives surplus medical equipment and supplies from hospitals, clinics, and individuals alike. This surplus is then donated



to others, generally in developing nations, for a modest administrative fee.

In just 10 months, MedCAN has provided equipment and supplies to the Ukraine, Uganda, South Africa, Spain, Peru, Ecuador, Honduras, Guatemala, Nicaragua, and the United States. Such recycling eliminates landfill waste, and healthcare is improved worldwide.

Distributing medical surplus may seem unrelated to the Fatherless, but there is a vital connection. MedCAN's purpose is more than improving healthcare or being "green". By offering valuable supplies to developing nations, Cornerstone is able to negotiate medical care for the underprivileged and advocate laws and programs that protect the Fatherless. MedCAN's revenue is reinvested into programs and the development of Cornerstone's members.
